Hello from all the staff at the National Motorcycle Museum and Hall of Fame. We hope your year was as exciting as ours! We hosted over 12,000 visitors this past year, each fascinated with our great collection of over 150 motorcycles from around the world.

Quite a few groups made us a priority stop this year including a group from France, one from Japan, the Kiev (Ukraine) Orchestra and Choir, and a deluge of RAGBRAI bike riders who flew through Anamosa on July 26th. (We finally had to close the museum at 10:30 PM!!). Visitors from Women on Wheels, the March of Dimes, a BMW rally, GoldWing riders, an antique car club, H.O.G. groups, and many other organizations found their way here.

If you haven't been here to see us recently we have some great surprises for you! Our most recent acquisition is a 1939 Indian Traffic Car. *This is believed to be the only complete, original and unrestored Indian Traffic Car in existence. This traffic car has a 74 cubic inch engine and is a chain-driven 3 wheeled motorcycle complete with a factory prepared delivery van body. And it runs! *Special thanks to the AMA Hall of Fame Museum for loaning us this motorcycle!** Also new are a 1957 125cc Taon Derny from France, a 1908 Indian Twin racer, a 1912 Indian 8-valve Boardtrack racer, a 1948 Indian Scout racer - model 648 (Floyd Emde's 1948 Daytona winner), a 1911 Indian Belt Drive, a 1974 Kawasaki 900, a 1973 Yamaha RD350, a 1912 Excelsior, and more!

As you can see things are always changing at the National Motorcycle Museum! If you haven't been to see us yet, we hope you visit soon. If you've been here before be sure to stop back. There's always something new and different to enjoy!
