The National Motorcycle Museum is proud to announce a stunning new addition to our collection. These two exquisite original bronze motorcycle statues were sculpted by world-renowned artist George G'ach. "Evilcanivel" (1971) and "Cafe Racer" (1976) have been generously donated to the Museum by G'ach's son Peter G'ach (Denver, CO) and daughter Ann Christine G'ach Peele (Locust Valley, NY).

George G'ach (1909-2006): Sculptor, painter, and teacher George G'ach was born in Budapest, Hungary. The son of the eminent sculptor, Stephen G'ach, George studied with his father until the age 18 when he attended the Fine Arts Academy in Budapest. He became an assistant professor there and was soon recognized as the finest young sculptor in Hungary. As he progressed, he worked in wood, stone, bronze, plastic and steel. In 1952 he came to the United States with his family and devoted himself to sculpting, painting and teaching art.

George was an extraordinary man who created over 1400 award-winning unique bronze sculptures and 997 paintings between 1952-1996. During his lifetime he won 50 awards including Gold Medals from the National Sculpture Society and Art Leagues in the New York area. A graduate of the world-renowned Academy of Fine Arts in Budapest, Hungary, G'ach traveled worldwide and was a professor at the Academy of Fine Arts in Beirut, Lebanon.

"The Museum is truly honored to add these beautiful pieces of artwork to our rich history of motorcycling. We thank the G'ach family for their wonderful donation," said Museum President John Parham.
